

Eligibility for ARC Manor Programs is open to anyone who has a problem with alcohol and other drugs or is impacted by substance abuse. No one is discriminated against on the basis of age, race, creed, sex, ethnicity, color, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, handicap or religion.

ARC Manor's priority populations include:

- Pregnant women who inject drugs,
- Pregnant women who use substances,
- Persons who inject drugs,
- Overdose survivors,
- Veterans, and

All others: pregnant women, adolescents, women with children, co-occurring, clients with severe medical issues, and/or clients individually reviewed by the primary Case Manager and the Case Management Supervisor or Executive Director and deemed appropriate for priority population status.

ARC Manor is licensed by the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, Division of Program Licensing, and is funded, in part, under a contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs.

ARC Manor is also funded in part by the Armstrong-Indiana-Clarion Drug and Alcohol Commission, the United Way of Southwestern Pennsylvania, the Armstrong County Commissioners through a grant from the Human Services Development Fund, private grants, fees, and community donations.
